On 5 July, the Commission proposed a package of measures for the sustainable use of essential natural resources and to strengthen the resilience of the EU's agricultural and food sectors. It wants to enable "safe use of technical advances in new genomic techniques" to make

On 5 July, the Commission presented new rules on the circular economy and the textile sector. The aim is to make producers responsible for the entire life cycle of textile products, and to encourage more sustainable management of their waste... Read more

EMPACT crime-fighting initiatives

On 3 July, the Council published the results for 2022 of actions to combat crime under EMPACT, the European multidisciplinary platform against criminal threats, which ensures an integrated approach to internal security. Across the 15 crime areas defined by the platform, law enforcement and judicial actions have led to 9,922 arrests, including 3,646 people smugglers, more than €180 million seized and 62 tonnes of drugs seized... Final launch of the Ariane-5 rocket



On 5 July, the European Ariane-5 rocket was launched for the 117th and final time from the Guiana Space Centre in Kourou. It successfully placed two satellites into orbit: the Syracue 4B defence satellite and a German technology demonstration satellite, Heinrich Hertz. It is due to

be succeeded by the Ariane-6 rocket in 2024... Read more

Around a million asylum requests in 2022



On 4 July, the European Union Asylum Agency published its annual report on asylum in European countries. In 2022, around 1 million asylum applications were registered in the European Union, the highest number since 2016. In addition, 4 million Ukrainians have fled the

Russian invasion and are benefiting from a special temporary protection status... Read more

Report on glyphosate

In a study submitted to the European Commission on 6 July, the European Food Safety Authority (EFSA) concluded that glyphosate, a controversial weedkiller, does not present a "critical area of concern" that would prevent the renewal of its authorisation in the European Union. The EFSA explains that it has not "identified any critical areas of concern for glyphosate in humans, animals and the environment", but does note "a high long-term risk in mammals" for half of the proposed uses of this weedkiller... Court of Justice:

Data protection ruling



The Court of Justice ruled on 4 July that national competition authorities have the ability to take into account breaches of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) as part of their market abuse investigations. This ruling stems from a 2019 case in which the German competition authority investigated the activities of Meta, Facebook's

parent company, observing that privacy breaches should be treated as an abuse of a dominant position... Read more

Catalan independence leaders have their immunity lifted



On 5 July, the Court of Justice rejected the appeal by the three Catalan pro-independence MEPs, Carles Puidgemont, Clara Ponsati and Toni Comin, concerning the lifting of their immunity by the European Parliament in 2021. This sanction was imposed following their

involvement in Catalonia's failed secession attempt in 2017... Read more

Report on the circular economy



On 3 July, the European Court of Auditors published a report on the circular economy which deplores the fact that "the measures and the mobilisation of several billion euros have had only a limited impact on the transition of the EU-27". The report considers that the stated objective of doubling the proportion of recycled materials by 2030 is "particularly ambitious"... Read more

ECB:

Consultation on new bank note themes



On 10 July, the European Central Bank officially launched a process to select new, less abstract designs for banknotes. Europeans are invited to indicate their preferences between the pre-selected themes in a public survey open until 31 August... Read more

European Patents Office:

European Inventors' Prize



On 4 July, the European Patent Office (EPO) awarded the "European Inventors of the Year" prize to a group of Finnish, French and Irish researchers. In the "industry" category, the award went to Finnish and

Czech chemists who have developed a sustainable aviation fuel. In the research category, a French team was singled out for its invention of a solid hydrogen storage system. In the "SME" category, two Irish physicists were honoured for the development of a composite material to reduce noise, with possible applications in the space and automotive industries... Read more

Germany:

2024 budget: the government wants to reduce public spending



On 5 July, the German government adopted Germany's federal budget for 2024 and the financial programming for the period up to 2027. The budget should total €445.7 billion in revenue and expenditure, almost €31 billion less than for the current year. Germany is thus within the

regulatory limit of the debt brake rule... Read more

Spain:

Visit by the Commission



On 3 July, the President of the Spanish Government, Pedro Sanchez, hosted the College of Commissioners in Madrid to mark the start of the Spanish Presidency of the Council and to recall the challenges facing Europe and the changes needed to meet them... Read more

Vote of confidence for the new government



On 9 July, the Greek Parliament voted 158 to 142 in favour of the government of Prime Minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis (New Democracy), which was formed following the legislative elections of 25 June... Read

Latvia:

Edgars Rinkēvičs sworn in and affirms his support for Ukraine



The new Latvian President Edgars Rinkevics was sworn in before Parliament on 8 July. The 49-year-old former foreign minister was elected president at the end of May. In his inaugural speech, he promised to work for a strong, modern, fair and secure Latvia, and to support Ukraine... Read more

Fall of the government and new elections



On 8 July, Dutch Prime Minister Mark Rutte tendered the resignation of his coalition government following the failure of discussions on migration policy. Early general elections are due to be held in the autumn... Read more

On 7 July, the Council and Parliament reached agreement on the regulation establishing the action in support of ammunition production (ASAP). A total of \in 500 million will be made available in the form of loans and financial assistance to companies, in order to increase the

The International Centre for the Prosecution of the Crime of Aggression against Ukraine (ICPA) began operations in The Hague on 3 July. This centre is responsible for investigating the Russian crime of aggression

with a view to preparing future trials, and will work in collaboration with the Commission and Eurojust... Read more

Visit to Bulgaria, the Czech Republic, Slovakia and Turkey



Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky travelled to Sofia on 6 July to sign a memorandum of understanding on cooperation in the energy sector. He then travelled to Prague, where President Petr Pavel and Prime Minister Petr Fiala assured him of their country's support for Ukraine's membership of the European Union and NATO. On 7 July, in Bratislava, he met President Zuzana Caputova and discussed cooperation on defence and foreign policy.

Finally, he travelled to Istanbul to meet Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan. The two leaders discussed Ukraine's membership of NATO and military and industrial cooperation... Read more

It welcomes the fact that the Member States have fully or partially implemented 65% of its recommendations from the previous year.
