Moreover the British government accepted to provide financial support of £1 billion to Northern Ireland... Read more

Scottish Prime Minister Nicolas Sturgeon announced on 27th June that the decision regarding the organisation of a further referendum on independence would be postponed until the autumn of 2018 after negotiations regarding the Brexit... Read more

On 29th June the Permanent Court of Arbitration in The Hague granted Slovenia access to international waters in its dispute with Croatia over the issue... Read more

The government of Serb Prime Minister Ana Brnabic approved in by Parliament



The Serb parliament confirmed Ana Brnabic as Prime Minister on 29th June, which is an historic decision. Her government of 22 members including 5 women won the support of 157 MPs against 55... Read more

On Monday 26th June the Ukrainian President Petro Poroshenko met with French President Emmanuel Macron to review the situation in Ukraine. President Macron again insisted on the fact that France did not acknowledge the annexation of Crimea by Russia... Read more

Promotion of integrity in governance to counter political corruption



By adopting a resolution on 27th June the Parliamentary Assembly at the Council of Europe invites governments to step up their fight to counter corruption by promoting integrity and transparency in public life at all levels... Read more

Meeting of Defence Ministers



On 29th June NATO's Defence Ministers decided to increase their presence in Afghanistan, to strengthen NATO and EU cooperation and to share the costs linked to security and the fight to counter terrorism more fairly... Read more

The Italian, French and German Ministers for Home Affairs want to "develop a code of conduct for NGO's" which are rescuing migrants in the Mediterranean and "strengthen support to the Libyan coastguards" they said on 3rd July... Read more

Eurostat :

The euro zone's annual inflation rate down to 1.3%



The euro zone's annual inflation rate is estimated at 1.3% in June 2017, against 1.4% in May according to a Eurostat dispatch published on 30th June... Read more

Unemployment stable in May at 7.8% in the EU and at 9.3% in the euro zone



The unemployment rate in the EU lay at 7.8%, a stable figure in comparison with April. This is the lowest rate recorded since December 2008. In the euro zone it lies at 9.3%, its lowest rate since March 2009, announced Eurostat on 3rd July... Read more

Knowledge and perceptions of the EU's regional policy



On 29th June the Commission published a Eurobarometer survey on "Raising awareness and citizens' perception of the EU's regional policy". It indicated that nearly 80% of the EU's citizens believe in the positive impact of projects funded by the EU in their town or region... Read more

Avignon Festival



From 6th to 26th July the 71st Avignon Festival is taking place - this is one of the biggest international contemporary arts events. Avignon turns into a theatre-town, hosting more than 130,000 visitors. On the programme: around thirty performances, lectures, exhibitions, films and debates... Read more

International Eisteddfod music festival



From 3rd to 9th July, the town of Llangollen is hosting the "Eisteddfod" an international Welsh dance and music festival that was first held in 1947. 4000 artists from over 50 countries will be performing and 50,000 visitors are expected... Read more

EXIT Festival in Serbia



From 5th to 9th July the EXIT music festival is taking place in the Petrovaradin fortress in Novi Sad, Serbia... Read more

Balaton Sound Festival



The Balaton Sound, one of the biggest electronic music festivals in Europe will be taking place from 5th to 9th July on the shores of Lake Balaton in Hungary... Read more

Venetian Renaissance at the Thyssen-Bornemisza Museum in Madrid



Until 24th September the Thyseen-Bornemisza Museum in Madrid is paying tribute to the Venetian paintings of the 16th century as its shows the masterpieces of Renaissance artists like Titian, Tintoretto, Veronese and Lotto... Read more
