She defeated Anze Logar of the Democratic Party (SDS) who secured 46.14%. The 54 year old lawyer is the first woman to become President of Slovenia. She will take office on 23 December...

In response to rising energy prices, Member States and the European Union have



taken action. In Germany, the Bundestag has approved the extension of the operation of 3 nuclear power plants until 15 April 2023. In Finland, the government decided to reduce VAT rates for energy and transport. The Foundation offers you a map to help you understand the situation. It is regularly completed and updated... European Recovery Plans: figures and priorities



In response to the economic and social consequences of the Covid-19 pandemic, the European Union has set up a $\[\in \]$ 672.5 billion recovery fund, known as the Recovery and Resilience Facility, for Member States in the form of grants and loans. On 8 November, Italy received a second instalment of $\[\in \]$ 21 billion after meeting 45 targets. On 7 and 10 November, the Commission approved preliminary assessments for

payments to Bulgaria and Croatia. The Foundation provides an interactive map of the country-by-country plans, including amounts, timetables and priorities... Read more

Ukraine/Russia:

Proposed financial assistance of 18 billion € for Ukraine



On 9 November, the Commission proposed a new \in 18 billion assistance package for Ukraine for 2023. The assistance will take the form of "highly concessional" loans and will be delivered in monthly instalments of \in 1.5 billion to ensure the payment of salaries and pensions and to

keep essential public services running, such as hospitals, schools and housing for resettled people. To cover short-term funding needs, this assistance should be matched by similar efforts from other major donors.. Read more

Solidarity corridors to strengthen global food security



The Commission and the Member States bordering Ukraine announced on 11 November the payment of €1 billion to facilitate the functioning of the trade routes linking Ukraine to the European Union. These corridors were created in May to ensure the export of Ukrainian

agricultural products, particularly cereals, and the import of products needed by the country... Read more

Road transport agreements with Ukraine and Moldova



On 10 November, MEPs approved two agreements aimed at facilitating the cross-border transport of goods between the European Union and Ukraine and Moldova. The aim is to provide alternative transit routes to air and sea routes for the export of grain, fuel and foodstuffs. In this

sense, an agreement includes the recognition of Ukrainian driving licences within the territory of the Union... Read more

Meeting between the Ukrainian president and the speaker of the Lithuanian parliament



Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy hosted on 11 November the Speaker of the Lithuanian Parliament Viktorija Čmilytė-Nielsen, who was visiting Kyiv as part of the session of the Parliamentary Assembly of Ukraine and Lithuania. He praised Lithuania's military, financial and humanitarian support. They discussed the European energy crisis and

the idea of using seized or frozen Russian funds to finance the reconstruction of Ukraine... Read more

Rejection of Russian passports delivered in Ukraine and Georgia



The Council and the Parliament agreed on 10 November on the plan not to accept Russian passports issued in the occupied regions of Ukraine and Georgia in the EU. The measure must be formally approved by both institutions... Read more

Commission:

Economic forecasts: the economy at a turning point



The Commission presented its economic forecasts on 11 November, which predict a recession in the last quarter of the year, but also growth for the year 2022 of 3.3% in the European Union and 3.2% in the euro zone, and only 0.3% for the year 2023 for both the European Union and the euro zone. The European Union is expected to see its inflation peak

at the end of 2022, at 9.3%. It is expected to fall to 7% in 2023 and recover to 3% in 2024... Read more

Proposed reform of economic governance



On 9 November, the Commission presented its proposals to reform the EU's economic governance framework, with the aim of simplifying it in order to strengthen Member States' ownership of and compliance with budgetary rules. It proposes to maintain public deficit ceilings at 3% of

GDP and debt at 60% of GDP, and suggests defining a budgetary trajectory for each Member State over a period of four years, adjusted to its financial situation, to restore its finances... Read more

Emergency measures to reduce dependency on Russian gas



The Commission proposed on 9 November the adoption of a regulation for the deployment of renewable energy sources to accelerate the process of independence from Russian gas. In this context, renewable energy installations would be deemed to be of overriding public

interest. In addition, it includes an acceleration of the procedures for the authorisation of the installation of solar energy equipment, the granting of heat pump permits and the renovation of power plants... Read more

Fisheries management and control agreements in the Mediterranean



At the annual meeting of the General Fisheries Commission for the Mediterranean (GFCM) on 11 November, the European Union and the neighbouring countries of the Mediterranean agreed on the establishment of five multi-annual joint management plans (JMPs).

They aim to limit overfishing and ensure a level playing field between Mediterranean fleets. In addition, the GFCM adopted 21 measures for fisheries control, aquaculture and the protection of sensitive habitats and the new GFCM 2030 strategy supported by an annual grant of €8 million... Read more

Parliament:

Energy measures in the resilience plans



MEPs gave the green light on 10 November to the inclusion of energy measures, as set out in REPowerEU, in national recovery plans to boost support for vulnerable households, SMEs and micro-enterprises. Member States will have to include measures to save energy, produce clean energy and diversify sources of supply. In addition, MEPs suggested that the €20 billion in additional subsidies proposed by the Commission should be

distributed taking into account the dependence on and increase in expenditure and the share of fossil fuels in each country's energy consumption. These rules will apply from 1 February 2023... Read more

New legislation regarding cybersecurity



MEPs adopted stricter cyber security standards for businesses, administrations and infrastructure on 10 November. The new legislation aims to harmonise different national standards and includes new obligations on risk management, including supply chain security, and

information sharing. The critical sectors of energy, transport, banking, digital infrastructure, public administration and the space sector are now covered. The text must now be adopted by the Council... Read more

New rules governing foreign subsidies



On 10 November, to close a legal loophole, MEPs approved a new tool to ensure that competition in the single market is rebalanced when foreign subsidies distort competition. The Commission will be able to monitor and take action to prevent direct aid from non-EU countries or preferential tax treatment from benefiting certain companies... Read

Transparency of the environmental and societal impact of businesses



On 10 November, MEPs adopted the Sustainability Reporting Directive, which obliges companies to regularly share data on their societal and environmental impact. With a view to combating greenwashing, the new rules require more detailed data to be published and for the information to be subject to independent certification and auditing. The Council now has to adopt the proposal... Read more

Vote in support of Croatia's entry into the Schengen Area



MEPs voted in favour of Croatia's accession to the Schengen area on 10 November and called on the Council to adopt a final decision to this effect. They reaffirmed that the country meets all the conditions for full membership. However, they urged Croatia to ensure respect for human

rights in its management of the external borders and called for an evaluation by the Commission in this context... Read more

Council:

Agreement on greenhouse gas emission reduction targets



The Parliament and Council reached a provisional agreement on 8 November on tightening up the greenhouse gas emission rules in the Fit for 55 package, notably by raising the mandatory reduction target for 2030 to 40%, instead of 30%, compared to 1990 levels. To achieve their national targets, Member States are following a stricter timetable, including an obligation not to exceed the annual quota. The new rules also restrict the

possibilities to transfer, borrow and save emission allowances and aim to increase transparency... Read more

Meeting of Economics and Finance Ministers



The Finance Ministers agreed on 8 November on the implementation of the Basel III Accord, which aims to strengthen the resilience, supervision and risk management of the banking sector; they also gave political guidance on the structural aspect of the financial assistance to Ukraine and endorsed the Commission's target to start monthly

disbursements to Ukraine in January 2023. They agreed on a revised code of conduct on business taxation and suspended the visa waiver agreement with Vanuatu due to its golden passport policy. They discussed, among other things, truck taxation, stimulus funds and the US Inflation Reduction Act... Read more

Diplomacy:

European action plan regarding cyber defence



On 10 November, the Commission, together with the High Representative, presented its new cyber defence policy, which aims to strengthen cooperation between military and civilian communities, particularly in response to recent cyber-attacks on energy

networks, transport infrastructure and space assets. The aim will be to strengthen EUwide coordination mechanisms, secure the defence ecosystem and consolidate investment and dialogue in this area... Read more

Easter Mediterranean: extension of sanctions against Turkey



The Council decided on 8 November to extend sanctions against Turkish individuals and entities for unauthorised drilling activities in the Eastern Mediterranean Sea until 23 November 2023. The sanctions include a

ban on entering the territory of the Union and a freeze on the assets of listed individuals... Read more

Signature of international agreements



In the margins of COP27, Commission President Ursula von der Leyen signed a strategic agreement with Kazakhstan on batteries, renewable hydrogen and feedstock supply on 7 November. On 8 November, she concluded a strategic partnership with Namibia on sustainable raw

materials and renewable hydrogen. On the same day, the EU launched a forest partnership with Guyana, Mongolia, Republic of Congo, Uganda and Zambia, which have committed to take action to reverse deforestation... Read more

Foreign Affairs Ministers' Meeting



On 14 November, the Foreign Ministers discussed the situation in Ukraine, food security, individual sanctions, protection of critical infrastructure and European military assistance. They discussed a new EU approach to the African Great Lakes region and agreed to intensify work on the Western Balkans region, which is suffering from various crises. They also discussed the situation in Iran and chemical weapons. They also adopted conclusions on women, peace and security, recalling in particular the importance of gender equality and human rights in all EU policies... Read more

Court of Justice:

The Court of Justice annuls a Commission decision



On 8 November, the Court of Justice annulled a Commission decision which had found that a tax measure taken by the Luxembourg authorities in favour of a company affiliated to Fiat constituted State aid incompatible with the internal market. According to the Court, the Commission erred in law as regards the identification of the "normal" tax regime applicable in Luxembourg. Commission Executive Vice

President for Competition Margrethe Vestager said that the decision provides important clarifications on the application of the EU's state aid rules and that its implications will be studied by the Commission... Read more

Cyprus:

Rejection of the observer status of the northern part of Cyprus in a Turkish organisation



The European Union officially refused on 12 November to recognise the observer status of the Turkish Cypriot secessionist entity, the Turkish occupied and internationally unrecognised "Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus", in the Organisation of Turkish States. The European Union only

recognises the Republic of Cyprus as a subject of international law, in accordance with UN Security Council resolutions... Read more

France's new strategic review



On 9 November, French President Emmanuel Macron presented France's new strategic review, which takes into account the increased risk of conflict between powers and technological developments. He stressed that "France's vital interests have a European dimension" and called for

a new security framework to be built after the war in Ukraine... Read more

Joint declaration with the British Ministers for Foreign Affairs



French Foreign Minister Catherine Colonna and her British counterpart, James Cleverly, met in Paris on 11 November. They recalled the stakes of the bilateral summit to be held next year. Environmental, energy and migration issues will be at the centre of discussions. They also reiterated their willingness to continue to support Ukraine, pledged to

strengthen cooperation to support peace in the Indo-Pacific region, and condemned the repression in Iran... Read more

On 14 November, Banque de France Governor François Villeroy de Galhau and Bundesbank President Joachim Nagel published an opinion piece on the need to accelerate the EU's Capital Markets Union project to promote financial stability... Read more

Macron hosts Iranian women



On 11 November, French President Emmanuel Macron hosted several Iranian dissidents at the Elysée Palace: Masih Alinejad, Ladan Boroumand, Shima Babaie and Roya Pirayi. This is the first meeting between the leader of a major power and Iranian women dissidents

since the beginning of the protest movement against the condition of women imposed by the Iranian regime... Read more

Immigration: towards a vital European policy



Following the affair of the Ocean-Viking ship that France welcomed in Toulon on 11 November with its 234 passengers, 175 of whom will be taken care of by 11 Member States in the framework of European solidarity, 4 countries (Italy, Greece, Cyprus and Malta), which are the

most exposed to the arrival of migrants along with Spain, called on 12 November for the European Union to reform the system for managing migratory flows. In a statement on 14 November, the French and Italian presidents, Emmanuel Macron and Sergio Mattarella, stressed "the need to create the conditions for full cooperation in all areas, both bilaterally and within the European Union". On 14 November, the French and British interior ministers, Gérald Darmanin and Suella Braverman, confirmed the implementation of measures to combat all forms of irregular immigration, including crossings of the Channel, in accordance with international law... Moldova:

European Union Financial Assistance



Moldovan President Maia Sandu hosted Commission President Ursula von der Leyen on 10 November in Chisinau. The latter announced that the European Union will provide $\ensuremath{\mathfrak{C}}250$ million to help Moldova meet its gas supply needs. A further $\ensuremath{\mathfrak{C}}50$ million will be provided to support the

most vulnerable people... Read more

Iceland takes the presidency of the Committee of Ministers



On 9 November the Irish Chairmanship of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe came to an end. The Organisation recalls the Committee's decision to hold a fourth summit of Heads of State and Government in May 2023 in Reykjavik, the creation of the Contact Group on Belarus and the work on a common legal response to the

Russian aggression against Ukraine. Iceland succeeds Ireland in the chair... Read more

On 7 November, the first meeting of the Contact Group on Belarus was held in Strasbourg with the representative of the democratic opposition Sviatlana Tsikhanouskaya. The aim is to establish cooperation between the Council of Europe and Belarusian democratic forces and civil society,

with a view to passing on the Organisation's expertise and fundamental values, such as human rights, the rule of law and democracy... Read more

UN:

European leaders' speeches at COP27



On 7 November, European leaders spoke at COP27 in Sharm el-Sheikh. French President Emmanuel Macron and Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez called on states to continue their commitments to the environment, despite the war in Ukraine and the energy threat from

Russia. Polish President Andrzej Duda denounced delays in energy transition targets caused by the Russian invasion. German Chancellor Olaf Scholz said that "there must be no global renaissance of fossil fuels. UK Prime Minister Rishi Sunak pledged to provide £11.6 billion in climate finance and triple his adaptation funding to £1.5 billion. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky stressed the link between peace and climate action... Read more

The United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) has announced that the world's population will reach 8 billion on 15 November, mainly due to population growth in Asia and Africa, which is now negative in Europe. India, with 177 million additional inhabitants, will have the highest population growth in 2023... Read more

NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg met with Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni on 10 November in Rome, where he praised her "strong personal commitment" to the transatlantic alliance and the key role Italy plays in the organisation. They discussed support for Ukraine and challenges from the South... Read more
