### **Political System**

#### Parliamentary republic

Head of State: Zoran Milanović (Social Democratic Party SDP), elected on January 5th 2020 (invested on February 18th 2020) for five years by direct universal suffrage. Prime Minister: Andrej Plenkovic since October 19th 2016 and reelected on April 27th 2024 for 4 years. He leads a coalition between HDZ and the Patriotic movement (DP).

Monocameral parliamentary regime: The Parliament (Hrvatski Sabor) comrising 151 seats; representatives are elected for four years by direct universal suffrage according to proportional representation.
