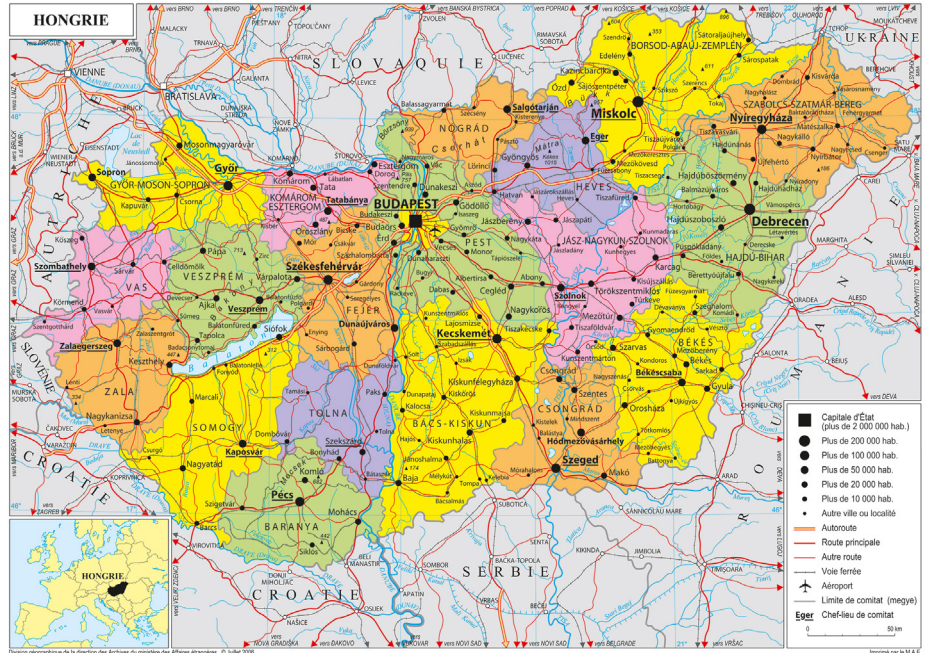

Political System

Republic, parliamentary democracy (The Fundamental law of Hungary, 25th April 2011)

Head of State: Tamás Sulyok was elected on February 26th 2024 for a 5-year term. He took office on March 5th 2024.

Prime Minister: Viktor Orban (FIDESZ), former Prime Minister from 1998-2002 and from 2010 to 2022, remained in office after the general elections of 3rd April 2022 for another four year term.

Unicameral parliamentary system:

The National Assembly (Országgyűlés) comprises 199 seats. The representatives are elected for four years by direct universal suffrage. During elections every citizen receives two ballot-papers. A separate ballot-paper serves voting on single mandate constituency candidates and another one voting on regional lists. While the number of single constituency MPs is always 106, the number of MPs from the regional and the national list vary election to election, however, the total number always adds up to 93.



Political Representation

Parliament composition (after the elections on 3rd April 2022):

- 135 seats Fidesz (Hungarian Civic Alliance) - KDNP (Christian Democratic People's Party)
- 57 seats United for Hungary (EM)
- 6 seats Our Homeland (MHM)
- 1 seat national Self-Government of Germans (MNOÖ)
