Political System

Republic, parliamentary democracy (Constitution of 1964, revised in 1974 when the island became a Republic and once again in 1994); bipartisan political system, inspired by the British system.

Head of State: Myriam Spireti Debono (Labour Party), elected in April 2024 by the Parliament for a period of five years

Head of Government: Robert Abela (Labour Party) since 13th January 2020, after Prime Minister Joseph Muscat has left his office following the

murder of an investigative journalist.

Unicameral parliamentary system:

The House of Representatives (II Kamra Tad Deputati) comprises 79 members, elected for five years through direct universal suffrage by proportional representation
