Political System

Republic, parliamentary democracy

Head of State: Rebelo de Sousa (Social Democratic Party -PSD) elected on 24th January 2016, by direct universal suffrage for a 5-year mandate, and reelected for a second and last mandate on 24th January 2021.

Prime minister: Luis Montenegro (Social Democratic Party, PSD) in office since 2nd April 2024. His center-right political coalition, the Democratic Alliance, won 80 of the 230 seats in Parliament in the parliamentary elections held on 10th March 2024. With around 30% of the vote, his government does not have an absolute majority in Parliament, but a relative one.

Legislative power is held by the Assembly of the Republic (Assembleia da República), which comprises 230 members who are elected for 4 years.
