

Political System

Republic, parliamentary democracy (Constitution of 16th December 1992)

Head of State: Petr Pavel was directly elected on 28th January 2023. He took office as President on 9th March 2023.

Head of Government: Petr Fiala (ODS) was appointed Prime Minister on 28th November 2021. He leads the coalition "Alliance Together" which includes 5 parties: the conservative liberal party (ODS), the Christian Democrats, the centre-right party TOP 09, the Czech Pirate Party (Piráti) and Mayors and Independents (STAN).

Bicameral parliamentary system:

The House of Deputies (Poslanecka Snemovna) comprises 200 members who are elected for four years by direct universal suffrage by proportional representation; a 5% threshold is required to gain entry into the

The Senate comprises 81 members who are elected for six years, with a third of the Senate up for election every two years.
